OKABENA-OCHEDA WATERSHED DISTRICT 2007 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Clean Water Partnership

- 1. Contributed \$2675.60 to the Okabena-Ocheda-Bella Clean Water Partnership Joint Powers Organization (JPO) for operating expenses.
- 2. Provided administrative and technical assistance to the JPO to manage CWP projects.
- 3. Conducted water quality monitoring of Lake Okabena monthly from April to October.
- 4. Splitting the cost with Worthington, provided incentive payments for 169 acres of filter strips covering 90 percent of the streams in the Lake Okabena subwatershed.
- 5. Conducted and paid for water quality monitoring of Lake Ocheda twice monthly from June through September. Reported data in STORET.
- 6. Conducted turbidity monitoring of Judicial Ditch 6 (Lake Okabena outlet) weekly from May through September. Reported data in STORET.

Conservation Practices

- 1. Made 50 CRP filter strip incentive payments totaling \$31,212.50 covering 329 acres throughout the District.
- Cost-shared to rebuild one grassed waterway.
- Cost-shared to seal three abandoned wells.
- 4. Made incentive payments totaling \$36,753.34 to place 34.9 acres in 45 year CREP II filter strip easements protecting surface and groundwater quality.

Wellhead Protection

- 1. Provided an incentive payment of \$40,908.09 to place 42.5 acres into a 45 year CREP II wellhead protection easements in the Malcolm and Bella wellhead protection areas.
- 2. Conducted a household hazardous waste pickup for rural landowners in the Malcolm and Bella wellhead protection areas. Disposed of 3000 pounds of hazardous waste from ten farmsteads.
- 3. Worked in partnership with Pheasants Forever and Worthington Public Utilities, and contributed \$25,000, to purchase approximately 155 acres of agricultural land in the Bella wellhead protection area. Approximately 65 acres of this land will be traded for a nearby similar sized parcel of restorable wetland. The land will be donated by Pheasants Forever to the DNR.

Public Information and Education

- 1. Sponsored educational tours including the Prairie Ecology Bus for 5th grade students at the Prairie Wetland Learning Area in September.
- 2. Published notices of permit requirements in the Daily Globe and On the Farm.
- 3. Worked for Worthington to accomplish educational components of the City's Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan including:
 - Creating storm water education factsheets and other content for the City of Worthington's website.
 - Installing 200 storm sewer markers in Worthington.
- 4. Worked with the Lake Okabena Improvement Association and Nobles County to:
 - Provide water quality education during Worthington's Windsurfing Regatta using the Prairie Ecology Bus.

- Install water quality education billboards for six months in two locations in Worthington.
- Print non-point pollution prevention advertisements in the Daily Globe.

District Property Maintenance

- 1. Repaired picnic shelter structures in Bella Park
- 2. Painted Bella Park restroom building.
- 3. Picked up litter and mowed weekly at Bella Park.
- 4. Sprayed to control thistles on the Ocheda Dam and Bella Park properties.
- 5. Replaced trees on the Ocheda Dam property.

Permits

Approved 50 permit applications including:

- 19 permits to install tile for agricultural drainage (82,150'),
- 2 permits for storm water control facilities,
- 27 permits for construction site erosion control,
- 1 permit for lakeshore stabilization,
- 1 permit for wildlife pond maintenance,
- 1 permit for drainage ditch maintenance, and
- 1 permit for a grassed waterway reconstruction.
